

The journey of Dr. Majeed is very interesting as is the separate growth trajectories of Sabinsa and Sami Labs. We try to get into Dr. Majeed's mind to find the reasons for Sami Labs's success and the way forward.



When a student flies abroad to hone his or her skills, it is a given that the talent is lost to India? What made Dr. Majeed come back to India?

I believe training and studies overseas broadens the mind and knowledge which was especially true in the 1970s. Even during my studies or employment with Pharma companies such as Pfizer, I realized that my roots were back in India. But I still longed to make an impact in the country where I studied and worked with a concept that is completely Indian. Being a pharmacist by profession and with an intense interest in herbal products, I ventured out to offer Ayurvedic line of products in the US where there was neither a tradition of use nor the existence of belief in these products. Once I created this strong foothold in the US for my business, I became aware that I had more unfinished business in India. Some of this journey is captured in a book, "Stepping Out of The Brain Drain" written by authors totally independent of me wherein they state returning migrants are a "win-win" situation!

People trained in western medicine do not often look at traditional medicine practices? What influenced and prompted this Kerala born doctor to tap the native wisdom to address the complex needs of today?

People trained in western medicine are not aware of traditional practices of medicine and this ignorance impels them to avoid considering alternative medicine. Modern medical education does not include a course on the healing properties of herbs in its curriculum. This is very strange especially considering that several successful pharma products were predicated on the discovery of new cures from plant-based products. Let me just cite the examples of Paclitaxel and Camptothecin which were enormously successful by themselves and also served as progenitors of more analogs. Being a native of Kerala and naturally imbibed in a tradition of using herbs for health, I felt a need to establish the role of herbal products in a population where it was considered black-magic. Time and again Dr. Majeed underlines the ancient wisdom of Ayurveda? How easy or difficult has it been for him and his group to get the advanced countries to accept and embrace these solutions. It would be interesting to know how Dr. Majeed and his team were able to bridge the communication

You can convince people if you show evidence. My journey through this was not easy or pleasant. First of all, when I started my business in the USA, the herbal products needed standardization and needed to be delivered in a form consumable such as tablets, capsules etc. Quality, batch to batch consistency are all prime criteria too. There is another arduous phase wherein you need show scientific and medical evidence in terms of biochemical studies on enzyme and cell systems, studies on animals to show efficacy and finally results from clinical studies. None of these beats the personal experience. When someone takes C3 Complex for their joint pain and finds relief, that is the best convincing argument. Next time they get a joint pain, they would think twice before using an NSAID or a steroidal medication with its own complications. If you are having a throat pain due to infection, it is easy to treat with turmeric extract than going through a course of antibiotics. In this context, University of Michigan study revealed that C3 Complex is safe up to 12 grams per dose. Accidental over consumption of herbal results in no damage and you will not say the same on a prescription drug. I am not deprecating pharma drugs but would reiterate the position of herbal products in human health.

Dr. Majeed seems to be the biggest advocate for Curcumin. Sami Labs and Sabsina have presented alternatives for Non-Alcoholic Fatty Liver Disease, Weight Control and as an Adjunct to Chemotherapy with Curcumin C3 Complex. Why is Curcumin such a potent herb? What is it that Curcumin has that makes it so effective?

Curcumin is an excellent anti-oxidant and anti-inflammatory. Many of the
